





## **Blackthorn**


'What you think's a completely different plant on surface - it's all from the same roots.'

A thriving Youth Cafe for 10-16 year olds meets on Mondays between 6pm – 8pm, at which young people plan and organise activities themselves.


During Science Week 95 young people enjoyed learning how science impacts on their everyday lives. They watched a demonstration of butter making and then made their own -and truffles too!






